The Holy Spirit

...but be filled with the Spirit ~ **Ephesians 5:18 (KJV)**

As it was with Christ Himself, so it is with His members. He was conceived by the Spirit, anointed by the Spirit, sealed by the Spirit. He was led into the wilderness by the Spirit, and by the Spirit He was raised from the dead; even so the members of Christ answer unto Christ Himself. All is by the Spirit; we are conceived by the Spirit, the same Spirit by way of union, and then unction follows after; when we are knit to Christ by the Spirit, then it works the same in us as it did in Him.

It is not enough to know by the Word that there is strength and righteousness in Christ, but the Spirit must open the eyes of the soul to see, else we shall only have a natural knowledge of supernatural things. It is necessary to have a supernatural light to see supernatural things, so as to change the soul, and therefore the Spirit only works faith to see Christ is mine. Further, only the Spirit can lead the conscience to rest because He is greater than the conscience and can answer all inward objections and quibbles of flesh and blood; unless therefore the Holy Ghost does effectually apply what Christ has done, the conscience will not be satisfied.

There are three main parts of our salvation; first, a true knowledge of our misery; and secondly, the knowledge of our deliverance; and then thirdly, a life conformable to the Word. The Holy Ghost only can work these; He only convinces of sin, and where He truly convinces of sin, there also of righteousness, and then of judgement, and leads us by faith to heaven.

Those that care not for the Word are strangers to the Spirit, and those that care not for the Spirit never make a right use of the Word. The Word is nothing without the Spirit. It is animated and quickened by the Spirit. The Spirit and the Word are like veins and arteries in the body, that give quickening and life to the whole body, and therefore, where the Word is most revealed there is most of the Spirit, but where Christ is not opened in the Gospel, there the Spirit is not at all visible in His saving power.

As the Spirit is necessary to work faith at first, so is He necessary also to every act of faith, for faith cannot act upon occasion but by the Spirit; and therefore we should not attempt to do, or suffer anything rashly, but beg the Spirit of God and wait for His assistance, because according to the increase of our troubles must our faith be increased. The life of a Christian commences by the Spirit's working faith at first but is promoted upon all occasions by His animating our graces already received. Faith stirs up all other graces and holds every grace to the Word, and so long as faith continues active we keep all other graces in exercise.

Love Toward God

When the love of Christ is manifested to us, and our love again to Christ is quickened by the Spirit, this causes an admiration in the soul, when it considers what wonderful love is in Christ, and the Spirit witnesses that this love of Christ is set upon us; from hence it begins to admire, "How is it that Thou wilt manifest Thyself unto us and not unto the world? What is the reason Thou so lovest me, and not others?" When the soul has been with God on the mount and is turned from earthly things, then it sees nothing but love and mercy. Such grace constrains us to do all things out of love to God and goodwill to men.

These inspiring meditations are taken from a book called "Divine Meditations" by Richard Sibbes who was born in 1577. He was educated at Cambridge and his call by grace came in 1602 when he became a preacher of God's sovereign mercy and redeeming love. All through his life his preaching of the gospel truth was highly valued. In 1633 he was made Vicar of Trinity Church, Cambridge. He died in 1635 and his last two sermons were on John 14:1,2.

A Wedding Long Ago and Far Away

"And the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. And both Jesus was called, and His disciples, to the marriage." **John 2:1,2 (KJV)**

The months of May and June are popular for celebrating marriages, and so our thoughts turn to the marriage which took place so long ago in Cana of Galilee. I wonder did the couple who were married that day realise who the LORD Jesus truly was, that He was the Messiah sent from GOD? Probably not at first, but it seems likely that by the close of the day, they may at least have had in inkling as to the identity of the One who miraculously helped them.

We are all familiar with the events of that occasion, how the LORD turned the water into wine, thus saving the families of the couple from much embarrassment, when their supply of wine ran out. The presence of Christ Jesus at this ceremony shows us that marriage is honourable in the sight of Christ. It is a sign of the mystical union between Him and His church. We see also the great loving kindness of the LORD, how He had compassion on the families and helped them so wondrously in a time of difficulty.

The first miracle worked by Moses (by the power of GOD) was when he turned the water into blood (Exodus 7:20) and the first miracle performed by the Saviour was when he turned the water into wine. We notice how the servants obeyed His command to fill the pots with water, and it would be good for us if we would likewise obey His commands, for we read that the LORD later said, "He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me" ~ **John 14:21(KJV)**

We are told also about the excellent quality of the wine, and the LORD'S people know that whatever He does for them, whatever gifts He gives, are far surpassing earthly treasures. We know also in our own experience that He is able to turn our water into wine spiritually. In place of our own ignorance and worldliness He gives grace and knowledge of Himself, and every lovely and needful thing.

Matthew Henry says, "It is desirable when there is a marriage, to have Jesus Christ present at it, to have His spiritual gracious presence, to have the marriage blessed by Him: the marriage is then honourable indeed."

And we remember in the final book of the Bible that the LORD says, "Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the LAMB." **Revelation 19:9 (KJV)** How wise it would be for us all to examine ourselves to see whether we are indeed among that blessed number who answer that call, because the gospel invitation is full and free to sinners such as we all are. ~ **Anon.**

This poem is by Robert Murray McCheyne (1813-1843) He was educated at the University of Edinburgh and went on to serve as minister at St. Peter's Church in Dundee. During a forced absence from his congregation he wrote them many letters which revealed a pastor full of compassion and concern for his flock. These letters are published in a book called "Pastoral Letters". He died age 29 from typhus and was buried in the graveyard beside St. Peters church with an estimated 7000 attending his funeral.
